Opportunities at the Department of Justice

The Attorney General's Honors Program (HP) is Justice's recruitment program for entry-level attorneys, and is the only way Justice hires graduating law students. Judicial law clerks, full-time graduate law program (LLM) students, and law school graduates in qualifying full-time legal fellowships are also eligible. The first opportunity for law students to apply for HP is the summer before their third year of law school. This year, the on-line centralized electronic application closes on **September 6, 2011**. The Summer Law Intern Program (SLIP) is Justice's competitive recruitment program for compensated summer internships. Law students who have completed at least one full semester of law school by the application deadline are eligible to apply; however, the majority of SLIPs are second-year law students who work at Justice the summer between their second and third years of law school. But the SLIP is also open to recent graduates between graduation and the start of a judicial clerkship or full-time qualifying legal fellowship. California Attorney General's Honors Program

Attorney General Kamala D. Harris is recruiting for the inaugural class of the California Attorney General's Honors Program, an entry-level hiring program for third-year law students, students in the final year of other graduate law programs, judicial clerks, those participating in other government or public-interest fellowships and newly admitted attorneys in their first year of practice. One Honors attorney will be designated as the Earl Warren Solicitor General Fellow and will exclusively work in the CA Solicitor General's Office.

The application deadline is October 3, 2011. The Honors Program is a **paid, two-year program** that offers the following benefits:

- formal training sessions to develop litigation skills and educate Program participants on the work of the DOJ's different legal sections;
- the opportunity to gain hands-on experience as a Deputy Attorney General including the chance to take a lead role in cases and independently draft motions and pleadings;
- and, the opportunity to help formulate Attorney General policy initiatives
