

As a Deputy Attorney General IV in the Land Law Section of the Public Rights Division, Ms. Sproul has represented state agency clients in litigation, has advised state agency clients on CEQA matters, as well as various general legal practice matters, and has also worked on CEQA-related legislative issues. Her state agency clients have included the State Lands Commission, the Coastal Commission, several of the state's land conservancies, and the California High Speed Rail Authority.

Before joining the Attorney General's Office in 1993, Ms. Sproul served for eight years as the Assistant Secretary for Legal Affairs at the Resources Agency, where her practice concentrated on CEQA, CEQA legislation, and the CEQA Guidelines; state agency operations and compliance with CEQA; and areas of natural resources law affecting the Resources Agency and its Boards, Departments, Commissions, and Conservancies. Her tasks included advising state agencies on CEQA compliance, legislation, and the CEQA Guidelines. Ms. Sproul has also previously served as legal counsel to the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, the California Air Resources Board, and the State Water Resources Control Board. She received her undergraduate degree from the University of California at Davis and her law degree from King Hall at the University of California at Davis.
