What is Federal Work-Study?

The Federal Work-Study Program provides funding for students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay education expenses. Work-Study jobs can be on-campus or off-campus.

If you work off campus, your employer must be a non-profit organization or a government agency, and the work performed must be in the public interest. The Federal Work-Study Program is a matching funds program, which means your employer must be able to pay a percentage of your total earnings (currently set at 50% of total earnings in 2011-2012).

To apply for Federal Work-Study at UC Davis School of Law students must:

1. File the 2011-2012 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>.
2. Complete and submit the Federal Work-Study Application to the Law School Financial Aid Office.

Did You Know?

Since your total financial aid award is limited to the 2011-2012 Cost of Attendance, Work-Study earned during the academic year will decrease the amount of your financial loans on a dollar-for-dollar basis.
