What is Federal Work-Study?

The Federal Work-Study Program provides funding for students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay education expenses. Work-Study jobs can be on-campus or off-campus.

If you work off campus, your employer must be a non-profit organization or a government agency, and the work performed must be in the public interest. The Federal Work-Study Program is a matching funds program, which means your employer must be able to pay a percentage of your total earnings (currently set at 50% of total earnings in 2010-2011).

To apply for Federal Work-Study at UC Davis School of Law students must:

1. File the 2011-2012 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at <http://www.fafsa.ed.gov>.
2. Complete and submit the Federal Work-Study Application to the Law School Financial Aid Office on or before **April 22, 2011**.

Did You Know?

Summer Work-Study allotments are part of your 2011-2012 academic year financial aid awards. Since your total financial aid award is limited to the Cost of Attendance for the academic year, using your work-study in the summer **will decrease the amount of financial loans available to you during the academic year**. You can mitigate the impact of this decrease if you carefully budget your academic year financial aid, but you must think about this in advance and determine if you wish to accept this arrangement.
